## **Good Works Walk Will Take Place Tomorrow**



Join the members of Indian Run and hundreds of others tomorrow morning for the 16th Annual Good Works Walk in Athens, Ohio. We will carpool together from the church at 7:00am and return around 3:00pm. There are different walking routes depending on capability (the shortest distance is just one block, but several options are available - link to <u>www.goodworkswalk.net/walk-descriptions</u> for details). The walk lasts approximately two hours, depending on the duration of the walk option you choose. During the walk, walkers

will have the opportunity to visit several of the facilities supported by this mission. If you would like to walk, make sure you arrive at the church parking lot tomorrow morning BEFORE 7am! If you cannot make the walk, please consider supporting those who do walk with your prayers and financial gifts of \$10, \$20, or a donation of your choice. All proceeds will be used to assist the temporarily homeless through the Good Works Timothy House, a shelter for rural homeless in Athens, Ohio. This walk is to educate the public about the reality of homelessness and poverty in southeastern Ohio. The hope is to generate needed financial support for the mission of the Timothy House. #### **ELEMENTARY & HIGHWAY 56**

February Theme: Rewind...Kindness deserves a reply. - Link to video preview

**Key Question:** How can you be kind to people you don't get along with? There are times when we face people who we feel don't deserve our kindness. Most likely, preteens have a list of people who they don't get along with and why those people don't deserve their kindness. But Jesus tells us to love our enemies. Through this question, we hope kids start to discover how they can show kindness to people who fall into this category.

We finish out our month in Matthew 5:43-48. In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus expands the scope of who deserves our kindness. Not everyone will be kind to us; some may be quite mean to us. Jesus says that we should love our enemies and pray for them.

**Bottom Line:** Be kind to people who aren't kind to you. As kids discover what Jesus says about loving our enemies, we pray that your kids discover ways they can show God's love and kindness to people they might not get along with all of the time. They don't have to be best friends, but they can be kind.
