## Volunteers Needed...Wall Raising Ceremony Tomorrow

Through our partnership with Hilliard Adopt-A-House, our Habitat for Humanity project at 1641 Myrtle Avenue for the Byrant family is currently underway! Volunteer opportunities exist for Wednesday and Saturday. We plan to hang the remaining trusses, install boards to tie trusses together, install a large beam to support a second story wall, and start the first-floor decking. **A wall raising ceremony is scheduled for Saturday, 6/17 at 9:30am with the Bryant family. Everyone is invited.** Work begins at 8:30am. With three Habitat houses being built close together, street parking might be challenging on Saturday. There is a church parking lot that is available across the street from our site. Volunteers will be limited to 18 and older. However, 16 and 17-year-old may accompany an adult but cannot operate power equipment. Please wear good work shoes/boots on the site. Please let Larry know by Tuesday noon if you will be able to participate Wednesday and/or by Thursday noon for Saturday. ## We're Hiring...Parents' Morning Out Coordinator

Indian Run is currently seeking to fill the position of Parents' Morning Out Coordinator. Children in the Parents' Morning Out (PMO) program are 2 years old. The PMO ministry provides free play, sensory table, reading stories, creating artwork, singing, dancing, and large muscle play while helping children to develop socially with their peers. The Coordinator is responsible for leading and administering the program - as well as teaching. This is a part-time position of 15 hours per week from September through June and 5 hours per week from June through August. Qualified candidates must be able to understand preschool and elementary age learning characteristics, create and follow curriculum, and relate well with children and adult leaders. Candidates must also be well-founded in Christian beliefs and passionate about children's ministry.
