Dublin Food Pantry Harvest of Hope Kicks Off on 10/22

The Dublin Food Pantry's annual Harvest of Hope Collection kicks off this Sunday at Indian Run. The Harvest of Hope will provide community members in need with Thanksgiving Boxes containing all of the traditional food items needed for a Thanksgiving dinner including a turkey, rolls and pumpkin pies, in addition to fresh fruit and produce. You can help in two FOOD PANTRY ways: First, this year the Pantry has asked Indian Run to collect 350 cans of sweet potatoes (small to medium sizes needed). You can drop off your donations in the Fellowship Hall until

Sunday, November 12. Secondly, you can donate money to help purchase Thanksgiving turkeys and pumpkins pies to be included in the Thanksgiving dinner boxes. Last year, the Pantry purchased turkeys for about \$15 each and pumpkin pies for about \$5 each. EDGE Youth Group Weekly Recap

Parents: Please share the following recap with your middle and high school students, if they missed last week's EDGE.

Last Sunday night, we spoke about why we do youth group, the way we do it, and about the four B's that people typically progress through as they approach an active lifelong faith. Not to worry...different people progress at different speeds and in different ways. Faith is a lifelong journey for everyone! People in earlier stages are not better or more deeply loved than people at later stages. Here are the "Four B's" or stages:

1. **Beginning** - Showing up and meeting people of faith. Most frequently this happens in an off-site (public) setting like HS Hangout or at a youth group special event (Corn maze anyone?).

- 2. **Belonging** When students have connected with at least 3 or 4 student members of our group, at least 1 adult volunteer, and feel comfortable enough to refer to us as their youth group. These connections usually form through team-building activities, youth games, events, and "the fun stuff" at EDGE.
- 3. **Believing** The moment when your head and your heart come into agreement that Christ is the son of God. You will still have questions. In fact, this often marks the beginning of a "searching for answers" and even a "searching for God" stage. Typically, this stage begins at a camp, retreat, or mission event and leads to a student joining a small group or bible study.
- 4. **Becoming** When a student's heart, through the Spirit, moves them to actively live out their faith and be the Church. Usually, this begins when a student both feels a deep connection/investment from a faith community, and an adult encourages them to regularly invest in an aspect of ministry (children's ministry, greeting, regular service at a local mission, etc.).

We then discussed how to help friends connect and grow toward becoming believers who actively live out their faith. I have found out that, after our discussion Sunday, several of you are actively investing in this plan (your parents tattled on you). I am proud to know you! May God bless your efforts!!!

If you have not started to think of ways to encourage friends to connect for the first time, or connect more deeply; it is not too late to start.

Also, please let us know if you are investing in friends so that we can pray for your friends.

Memory Verse: "Whoever can be trusted with very little can also be trusted with much." Luke 16:10a, NIV **Key Question:** How can you best use your money? They may not have a lot of it, but kids this age are starting to have some "pocket money" of their own. And even if they don't, now is a perfect time to set a foundation of stewardship related to how we use the money we have in a way that honors God. We'll walk kids through the principles of give, save, and spend, so when they ask themselves this question, they'll have a perfect starting point to make wise choices with their money throughout their lives.

A huge way we can use our money wisely is by how we give some away to help others. We'll look at something Paul wrote in 2 Corinthians 9:6-7, Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give . . . God loves a cheerful giver, (NIrV). We have opportunities every day to spend money on all sorts of things and experiences. But what if we looked at our money differently? What if we looked at money through the eyes of stewardship and saw that how we use our money reflects how we take care of what God has given to us.

Bottom Line: Use your money wisely. One of the best ways we can use our money is to give some away and allow God to something amazing with it. We'll help kids figure out ways they can give, save and spend their money wisely.

Exciting Changes Coming Up for Our Friends at New Life

As you may remember, the final worship service of the New Life United Methodist Church took place on Sunday, May 21. Since then, much prayer and planning have taken place, and they are excited to provide the following updates:

While the connection with North Broadway UMC continues, New Life United Methodist will now be known as Short North Church and will retain its affiliation with the United Methodist Church.

- Vendors and contractors have been identified, and preliminary designs for renovations to the building have been completed. They are now beginning the final plans with the architect, and the permit / bidding process will take place through the end of the year.
- From December March 2018, construction will take place to remodel and upgrade the whole facility. .
- The Short North Church plans to re-open for services in the Spring of 2018.
- During this transition phase, the New Life Community Outreach (NLCO) continues to be a beacon of hope and provider of life-sustaining ministries to the homeless and working poor of Short North area.
- NLCO is now officially an independent, non-profit, 501(c)3, United Methodist-affiliated organization.
- As of 10/11, the Clothing Room Ministry will temporarily be suspended for approximately 6 weeks, while remodeling in that area takes place. They hope to have this portion back in full operation on 12/03. Indian Run will continue to accept donations for New Life and will deliver to partnering organizations during the clothing room closure.
- The Breakfast Ministry and Health & Wellness Clinic will continue as is.
