Dublin Food Pantry Last Chance to Support Harvest of Hope - Due 11/12

The Dublin Food Pantry's annual Harvest of Hope Collection wraps up THIS Sunday, 11/12. The Harvest of Hope provides community members in need with Thanksgiving Boxes containing all of the traditional food items needed for a Thanksgiving dinner including a turkey, rolls and pumpkin pies, in addition to fresh fruit and produce. You can help in two

ways: First, Indian Run is partnering with area churches to fill the boxes by **collecting 350 cans of sweet potatoes** (small to medium sizes needed). Donations can be dropped at the table in the Narthex until Sunday, November 12. Secondly, you can donate money to help purchase Thanksgiving turkeys and pumpkin pies to be included in the Thanksgiving dinner boxes. Last year, the Pantry purchased turkeys for about \$15 each and pumpkin pies for about \$5 each. In 2013, 17.6 million Americans lost \$8.6 million in just phone fraud alone. In 2017, that number has risen significantly! Sadly, scammers like to target older people by playing into our fears about the aging process and that our memories are slipping! On Wednesday, November 15 at noon, the OWLS will host a potluck luncheon in Fellowship Hall with guest speakers,

Danielle Murphy Of the Consumer Protection Section and Sylvia M. Pla-Raith of the Consumer Protection Service - Elder Justice Unit from Ohio Attorney General, Mike DeWine's office will present on the subject of Scams Targeting Seniors. 

Key Question: What are you grateful for? Kids will learn soon enough, that sometimes it's hard to feel

grateful. Through asking this guestion, we hope kids will come away with a plan to refocus on what really matters and discover how they can show gratitude.

In Matthew 20:1-15, we'll dig into a parable Jesus told one day about some vineyard workers. In the story, a few of the workers started making comparisons to what others were getting paid and became ungrateful and started complaining. Then, at the end of the day, they had a bad attitude because they thought it wasn't fair. **Bottom Line:** Adjust your attitude. We can change our whole outlook on life if we take the time to refocus and think about all that we've been given. We pray that kids will see their own life differently and discover all the ways can show gratitude.
